

FSP Adult and Older Adult Services

Program Description: The Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Full Service Partnership (FSP) serves Adults 26 to 59 years of age and Older Adults 60 years and above. This program provides AB34 type services that employ ‘whatever it takes’ recovery models and use methods and interventions that are person-centered and strength based. The goal is to assist enrollees to regain hope, develop self determination, and take personal responsibility. All services are voluntary and driven by individual choice. The delivery of all services is guided by the principles of cultural competence, recovery and resiliency with an emphasis on building the enrollee’s strengths and resources in the community, with family, and with their peer/social network.

Eligibility Criteria: Seriously mentally ill adults, 26-59 years of age and older adults age 60 and above are eligible, respectively, if they have histories of hospitalization, institutionalization, substance abuse, poor compliance with medication treatment and difficulties in structured activities and living independently. Enrollees may be MediCal eligible or uninsured.

Referral Source/Referral Procedure: Candidates are referred through the Santa Clara County Mental Health Department 24-Hour Care Unit and approved by the Governance Committee. The FSP Coordinator reviews the referrals and forwards them on to the team.

Client Fees and Payment Requirement: MediCal Billing: Certain medical clients have a share of cost. Healthy Kids and Healthy Families.
