

FSP Children

Program Description: The Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Full Service Partnership (FSP) for Children services are designed to be intensive and include individual and group therapy, rehabilitation, case management and medication support services. Children and their families receive services from a diverse treatment team which includes Peer and Family Partners with life experience in addition to traditional therapists and case managers. The delivery of all services is guided by the principles of cultural competence and emphasis on building strengths and resources in the community and within the family.

Eligibility Criteria: Serious Emotionally Disordered (SED) children/youth who are at high risk and may have had multiple Emergency Psychiatric Services (EPS) episodes and/or frequent and extended hospitalizations. Priority populations are Juvenile Justice-involved Latino, African American, Asian/Pacific Islander and Native Indian. Enrollees may be MediCal eligible and/or uninsured and must be approved by the Governance Committee.

Referral Source/Procedure: Referral sources come from the FSP Coordinator via the Santa Clara County Mental Health Department Governance Committee.

Client Fees and Payment Requirement: MediCal Billing: Certain medical clients have a share of cost. Healthy Kids and Healthy Families.
